Our Ancient Man team is busy working on a new idea for book 3 which I think will be the best yet: a travel guide of Ancient Man sites in the United States. So far, we have identified over 200 sites! Imagine traveling across the country with our book illustrating the site with pertinent information and its significance from a Biblical perspective.

During Bev's and my recent trip to Answers in Genesis, we stopped at Effigy Mounds National Monument in Northeast Iowa. This site along the Mississippi River features 200 mounds with 30 of them in the shape of animals or birds. We hiked two miles and stood amazed on the cliff over the river, standing at the great bear mound. Why such labor? For what purpose? What connection is there to other ancient groups? What happened to them?

A very recent estimate is that there are 300,000 mounds in the U.S. alone. The question that immediately leaps to our minds is, "What is the connection to the Tower of Babel?"

While on the trip we met with our editor at New Leaf Press to finalize our new book, *Leaving a Legacy*. This should be available by late January. We also visited the Creation Experience


Museum just north of Branson, MO. We had a personal tour from the founder, Rod Butterworth. The museum was excellent and we enjoyed our time there.
